Electric Vehicle (EV) & EV Charger Incentives



Making the switch to electric vehicles more affordable.

Driving electric is one of the easiest ways to reduce your greenhouse gas emissions, but for many Humboldt County residents, the cost of an electric vehicle (EV) and charger can be a barrier. The good news: there are several incentives available that make owning an EV more affordable.

Below is a list of incentives currently available to Humboldt County residents.

Important Information

When available, all incentives in this list can be combined with Redwood Coast Energy Authority's (RCEA's) self-funded Transportation Community Choice Energy incentive programs.

This list is compiled by Redwood Coast Energy Authority (RCEA) staff to provide a valuable resource to Humboldt County residents who own or are interested in purchasing an EV. Although RCEA staff members extensively research incentive information to create this list, it is **not** a complete list of *all* available EV and EV charging incentives.

The incentives listed below are **not** offered by or associated with Redwood Coast Energy Authority (RCEA) unless otherwise specified. Some of the listed incentives can be combined with each other. Electric Vehicle (EV) Incentives

Driving Clean Assistance Program (DCAP)

Incentive Type: Grant / Financing Assistance

An expansion of the Clean Cars 4 All program (CC4A), DCAP offers a variety of incentives:

- Up to \$12,000 for purchasing an EV and a charging support grant up to \$2,000.
- Up to \$7,500 Clean Mobility Option for public transit, car sharing, bike sharing, and electric bicycle (e-bike) passes
- Financing Assistance Grant – up to \$7,500 towards the purchase of a new or used EV + a \$2,000 Charging Incentive for [income-eligible](#) applicants residing in a [low-income community](#)

Eligibility and awards are based on income status and whether you plan to scrap a vehicle before getting the incentive. **DCAP is not a rebate program**; California residents must apply and be approved before ordering, purchasing, leasing, or scrapping a vehicle. Pre-Owned EV Rebate Program

Incentive Type: Rebate

Incentive Source: Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E)

PG&E is providing two rebates for pre-owned EVs. The rebates include a \$1,000 standard option and a \$4,000 income-qualified option. These PG&E rebates are available to RCEA customers. See list of [program requirements](#) on the PG&E website. Applications must be submitted within 90 days of vehicle purchase or lease date. After September 1, 2026, only income-qualified customers will be eligible for the rebate.

GM Educator Appreciation Program

Incentive Type: Grant at Point-of-Sale

Incentive Source: General Motors

The General Motors Educator Appreciation Program provides eligible participants residing in the United States with the opportunity to receive \$500 towards the purchase or lease of new General Motors EVs from a participating dealer. Eligible vehicles include Chevrolet and Cadillac EVs, see full list [here](#). Eligible participants are active employees of a Pre K-12 public school, private school, as well as University or College Professor and Faculty. See website for more information. Stackable with other rebates and incentives.

Costco Members-Only-EV-Incentive

Incentive Type: Incentive Certificate at Point-of-Sale

Incentive Source: Costco Auto Program

Executive Costco members can access a point-of-sale incentive for specific EV models at the dealership. Incentive values range from \$1,000 to \$2,000 depending on the selected vehicle and customer membership level. Register on the website for a certificate to receive a member-only incentive code. Current program expires August 31, 2026. Stackable with other rebates and incentives. See website for more details.

MyFirstEV Program – coming soon

RCEA Discount Public EV Charging Program

RCEA recently launched a new program to make public electric vehicle (EV) charging more affordable for income-qualified residents in Humboldt County. Through a partnership with the nonprofit GRID Alternatives, eligible RCEA customers can receive a 40% discount on charging at RCEA's REVNet public EV charging stations. The program is designed to help reduce transportation costs for households that rely on public charging access.

Residential Charging Solutions Program

Incentive Type: Rebate

Incentive Source: Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E)

PG&E is offering two types of rebates for approved charging equipment installed in a customer's home:

1. **Standard Option:** Eligible applicants may receive a rebate valued at 50% of the total cost of the charging equipment.
2. **Rebate Plus Option:** Available to income-qualified applicants only. Eligible applicants may receive a rebated valued at 100% of the total cost of the charging equipment.

Rebates are administered on a first-come first-serve basis. This PG&E rebate is available to RCEA customers.

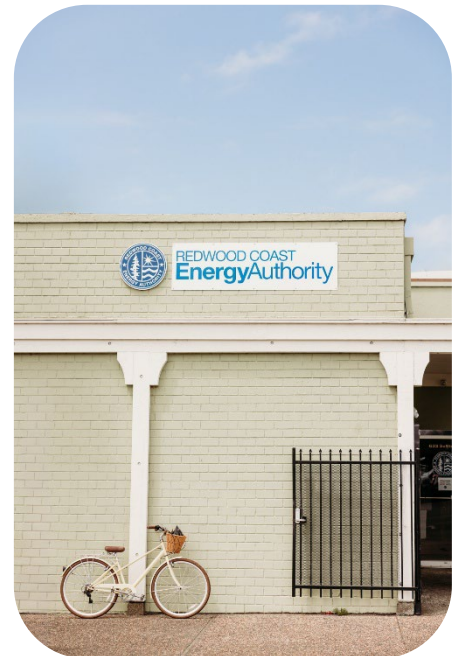
